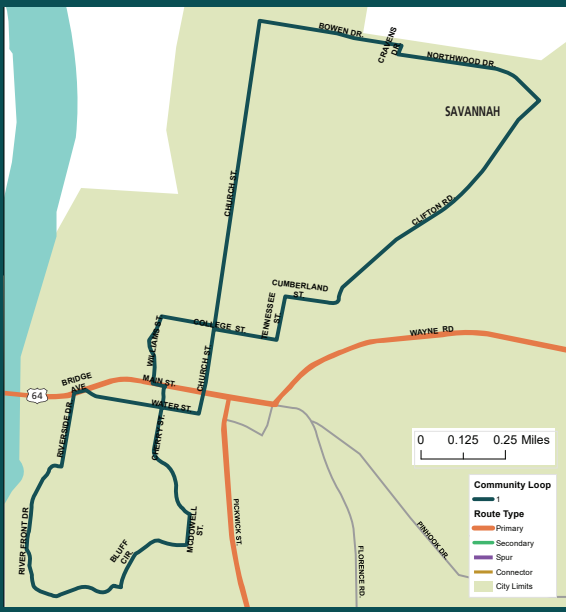


SAVANNAH COMMUNITY LOOP HARDIN COUNTY

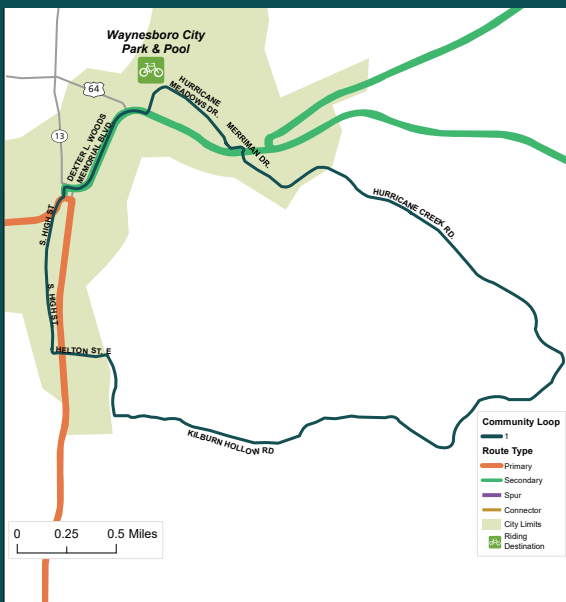


Take a step back in time in Savannah, Tennessee with a ride in this historic river town. This 6.2-mile ride will take you through the Savannah historic district with stately homes and river views at the Cherry Mansion. Make a stop at the recently completed Tennessee Street Park and follow the trail along Riverfront Drive where you will enjoy more spectacular views of the river. Do not forget to stop in at the Tennessee River Museum where you can learn more about the area and its local history.

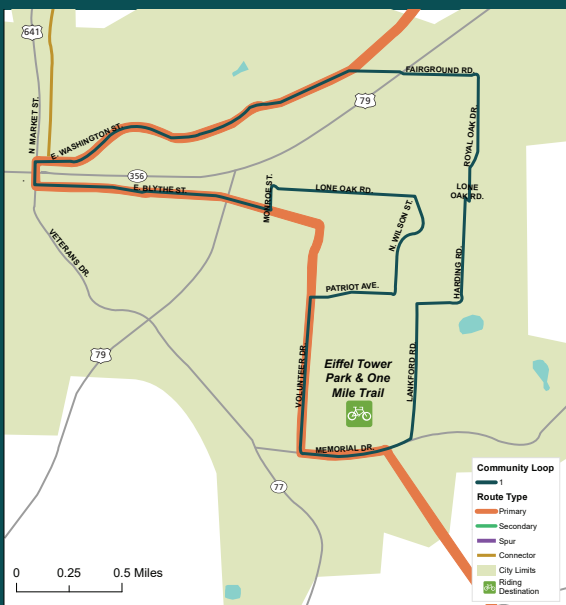


At just under 8 miles in length and 437' of elevation change, the Waynesboro Community Loop provides a scenic ride that includes historic downtown Waynesboro and the scenic countryside around the city. This trail will bring you by the Waynesboro City Park and the Wayne County Public Library. While in town, be sure to enjoy some of the local restaurants and shops around the square.

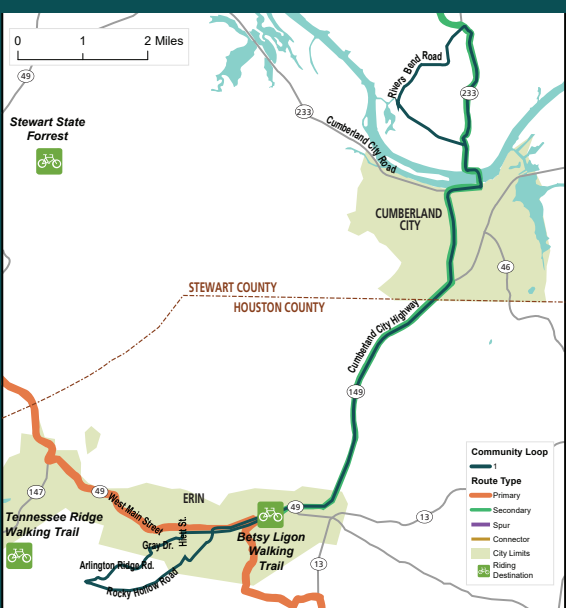


The City of Paris loop ride is a comfortable 8.4 miles with just 374' of elevation change. Enjoy vibrant downtown Paris with its many shops and restaurants, or stop off at Eifel Tower Park to see the scaled replica of the Eiffel Tower. This ride will take you through some of the downtown Paris neighborhoods as well as through the immediate countryside.



ERIN-CUMBERLAND CITY COMMUNITY LOOP HOUSTON AND STEWART COUNTIES

Located in Houston County, the Erin - Cumberland City Loop provides 27 miles of scenic countryside with approximately 1,500 feet of elevation change. The highlight of the ride is a ferry crossing the Cumberland River at Cumberland City, just a short 7-mile ride from Erin. Other attractions along the way include Betsy Ligon Park in the City of Erin with a paved off-road rail to trail excursion and the Wells Basin Meteor Crater, a 7.5-mile diameter earth strike that is estimated to be 200 million years old. Spend some time in the City of Erin, the Houston County seat, and enjoy lunch on the square or visit the twin limekilns on West Main Street.
